



Who we are

The governance structure of Mediterranean Rail Freight Corridor is composed of:

- The Executive Board, with the representatives of the Ministries of Transport of the involved Member States;
- The Management Board, with the representatives of the Infrastructure Managers and the Allocation Body of the involved Networks:
- A Permanent Management Office (PMO), seated in Milano and coordinating the working groups.
- Two Advisory Groups, representing Terminals (TAG) and the Railway Undertakings (RAG).

MED RFC in brief:

Mediterranean RFC has been set up on November 2013 according to Regulation (EU) 913/2010. It crosses 6 Countries of the European Union: Spain, France, Italy, Slovenia, Croatia and Hungary. Mediterranean RFC is at the service of 18% of the population and 17% of European GDP; with its development East-West involves 3 of the 4 main manufacturing areas of Europe: Catalonia, Auvergne-Rhone-Alpes system, the Piedmont-Lombardy system.
